## International Conference On Prison Abolition 24-27 June 1985

Amsterdam, 24th June 1985.

Dear participants to ICOPA '85,

Welcome to the Second International Conference on Prison Abolition in Amsterdam, that has been organized by the Criminological Institute of the Free University Amsterdam by request of the steering-committee of the first ICOPA in Toronto, Canada of May 1983, and in continuation of the abolitionist section at the IXth International Congress on Criminology in Vienna, Austria in the autumn of that same year.

Academics, activists working in the field of criminal justice, and interested politicians have been invited to participate. The conference is meant to be a working-congress, a think-tank for alternatives to, and stategies to achieve the abolition of, the prevailing system of criminal justice with the prison as its repressive core.

Looking at the programme you will notice that, of the three lectures planned, one is held by a scientist, one by someone who is working with abolitionist theory in practice, and one by a politician who feels very much sympathy for abolitionist thought.

National presentations are meant to present a survey of the differences between the criminal-law climate and abolitionist focusses in the several countries. Various items will be discussed in groups of c. 25 people. The gathered information from this sections and workshops will be integrated in a more general abolitionist perspective by a paneldiscussion at the end of the conference. The results of the conference will be published in a congressbook which might become an abolitionist manual. Participants will be informed about this by December 1985.

Though we have tried to place as much signs as possible, it might be hard to find your way in the Free University. You will find a map of the building at the main-entrance, near the porterslodge. The first sign of the roomnumber indicates the number of the floor, the second sign the wing of the building, and the last two the number of the room: so 2A-05 means: second floor, A-wing, fifth room, and OD-02 means groundfloor, D-wing, second room.

We hope you will have a good conference.


